Andrew Kidd was born and raised in Edgewood, KY where he first attended elementary schools in the Kenton Co. School system and in second grade transferred to St. Pius X School, also in Edgewood. In the middle of his 7<sup>th</sup> grade year Andrew received an invitation to test for the Covington Latin School. He was accepted and skipped his 8<sup>th</sup> grade year to become a Freshman at CLS. While there Andrew was an honors student, nominated for "Cornona Studii", was awarded Magna Cum Laude on the National Latin Exam and received 2<sup>nd</sup> place for the Annual Medieval Day Project. During these years Andrew also studied martial arts at Northern Kentucky Shaolin Do where he received his first degree black belt.

In the fall of 2018, he and his family moved to Fort Thomas and Andrew enrolled at Highlands High School where he was able to explore a wide variety of regular and

advanced placement class offerings. 


#### Sunday, June 20, 2020 - Father's Day
